How do we promote British Values?



At Moldgreen Community Primary School we value the diverse backgrounds of all pupils and families and understand the importance of helping to prepare children for life in modern Britain. Through a range of curriculum topics, we teach and reinforce British Values on a regular basis- please see below for some examples:

- Pupil voice is incredibly important at Moldgreen- children have their voices heard through School Council, assemblies and questionnaires.
- Pupils stand for election and pupil votes are taken.
- As part of the Rights Respecting Award work in school, children write a class charter at the start of each year which are then displayed in classrooms.



- The importance of rules and laws are reinforced on a regular basis throughout the school day. Pupils are taught through circle time and Rights Respecting work about the law and why different laws are in place.
- Equally, the children are also taught about the consequences of when rules and laws are broken and how everyone has a responsibility to uphold the law.
- During the school year, the behaviour policy is consistently applied, and through this, children understand the importance of rules, responsibility and related consequences.
- Visits from authorities such as the Police begin in Nursery and we have regular contact through assemblies and local competitions with the PCSO.

- Pupils in school are encouraged to make choices in many aspects of school life.
- Children are taught the importance of making safe choices through PSHCE lessons.
- We provide a caring, safe environment in which children can make choices safely.



- Respect is hugely important at Moldgreen and this is reflected in our behaviour and anti-bullying policy.
- Respect for self and others is taught and discussed during PSHCE, RE and during assemblies.
- Staff in school consistently model this and talk to children about the importance of showing respect.



- At Moldgreen we value the diverse backgrounds of all pupils and families.
- Children at Moldgreen get to experience diversity daily and understand that we are all different.
- Assemblies are led by staff aimed at discussing tolerance and prejudice.
- RE and PSHCE allow children to have the opportunity to learn about different beliefs and customs and to engage in discussion.
