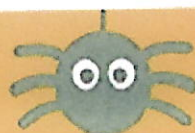
However, no-one should overlook Liall's impact on the game either as the tall defender was sensational. His skill, flair and vision made him one of the very best players to watch in the tournament.

Kayden 'It is an honour to represent Moldgreen and I always try my best.'

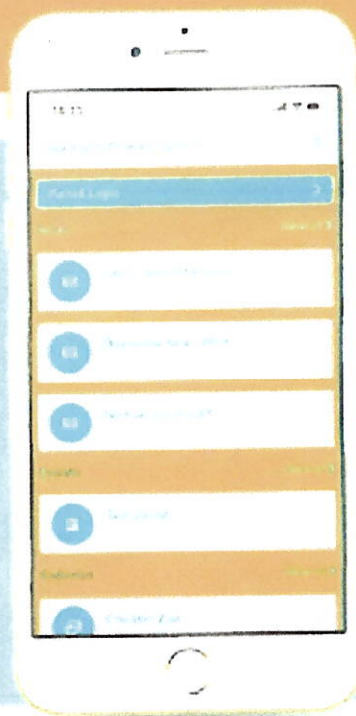
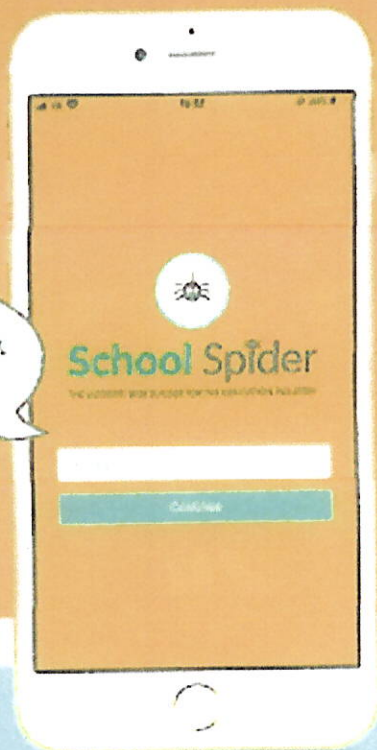
Mr Millington 'I was extremely proud of the boys. It was a very good performance and I felt we were always in control of the game. It was a great team performance!'

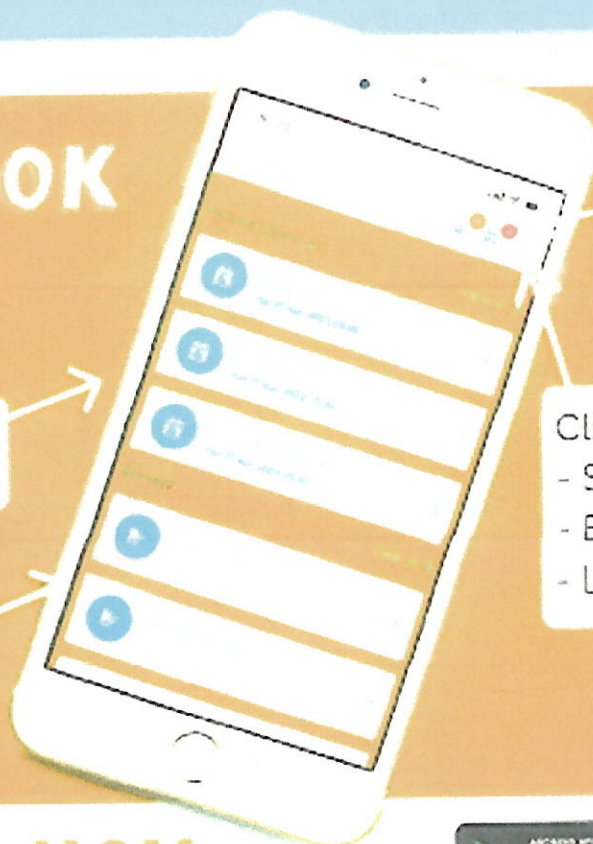
LOGGING IN
