Also please note that if you are leaving your child/children in the care of someone else for a period of time for any reason make sure that you inform the office so we know who to contact in case of illness or injury.

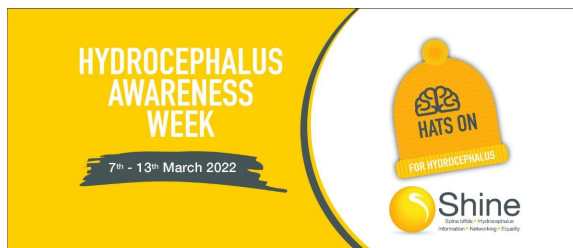
## Fundraising Day

School Council have decided to raise money for two charities on Thursday 10th March. The charities they have chosen are Eden's Army and Shine.

Eden's Army is currently organising lots of fundraising events to raise funds for 6-year old Eden, a local girl who was diagnosed with Stage 4 Neuroblastoma (a very rare childhood cancer) in April 2021. We would like your help to raise funds to help Eden's treatment by wearing pink for the day for a voluntary donation. On Thursday 10th March it will be Eden's 7th birthday and pink is her favourite colour.

Shine provides specialist support from before birth and throughout the life of anyone living with spina bifida and/or hydrocephalus. This Hydrocephalus Awareness Week (7th - 13th March 2022) the charity Shine are increasing awareness of the condition and raising vital funds to provide specialist advice and support for those living with hydrocephalus. 'Hydrocephalus' describes conditions in which there is a build-up of excess cerebrospinal fluid (CSF) in the chambers of the brain, it compresses the surrounding tissue and raises the pressure inside the skull. This is a charity very close to our heart as a school because we have a member of our school community who is living with this condition. We would like to take part in 'Hats On for Hydrocephalus' on Thursday 10th March to increase awareness and raise vital funds for Shine.

School Council would like you to either wear pink or wear a hat (or both!) to school on Thursday 10th March and bring in a voluntary donation to help these charities. All funds raised will be split between the two charities.



## Star of the Week

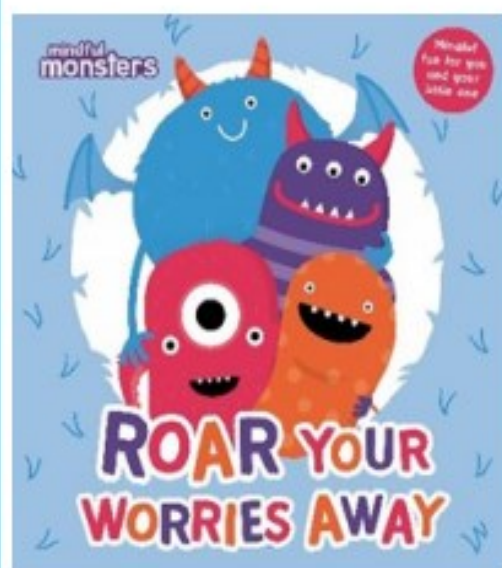

## Book Recommendations from Kirklees Mental Health Support Team

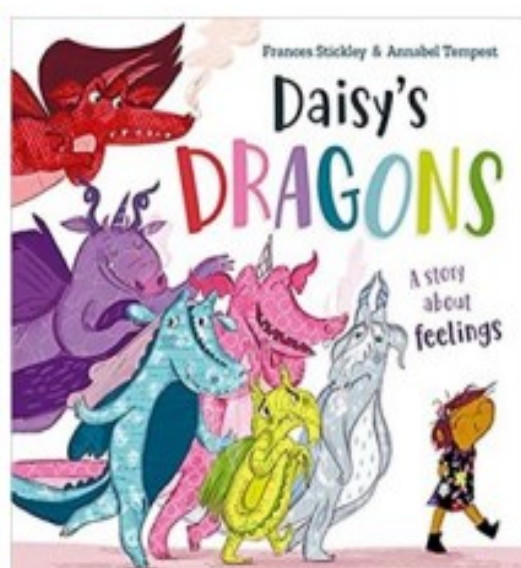

The perfect book for anxious little ones, with mindful fun to help roar their worries away and introduce younger children to mindfulness.

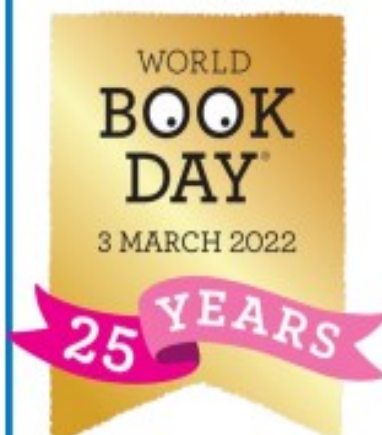


Beautifully illustrated, this gentle picture book invites children to share how they are feeling – whether happy, sad or anywhere in between, through conversation, drawings or writing.
