<ul style="list-style-type: none"> We aim for our pupils to have the relevant skills to be 'Young Musicians' and they understand how music can be a lifelong hobby or have careers options. We aim to create opportunities for all children to learn a musical instrument in school. Children will have opportunity to performance and listen to skilled musicians to improve their skills and appreciate a range of music. Ensure that the children use their skills to perform for an audience locally (community such as nursing home) and in national festivals such as Young Voices. Ensure that the music curriculum has progressive skills and ensures that children learn key vocabulary. The subject leader will support staff with professional development and monitor lessons to ensure that lessons are good. Create enrichment opportunities for children to join After School Clubs in choir, African Drumming etc. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Teachers subject knowledge is audited annually to ensure teachers are fully equipped to teach the subject. Professional Development is identified through the Performance Management cycle. Lessons are planned and objectives shared with pupils. Children attend After School Clubs Music vocabulary is shared in lessons so children remember it. The subject leader ensures that there are adequate resources to teach each topic. Monitoring of music is carried out termly and feedback given to lead to improvement. Different pieces of music are shared in assembly to inform children about composers. The subject leader will attend music networks to keep up to date with current educational thinking.
